## SERVED HOMELESS FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

171 families with 386 children in all our programs

## **21 FAMILIES IN SHELTER**

32 adults, 47 children stayed in our shelter

### **OVER 90% of FAMILIES**

of families that could have reached one year in housing did so, thanks to case management and stable housing programs

### **HELPING TO END HOMELESSNESS**

89% of families who exited our shelter program remain stably housed

### **8 PERMANENT HOUSING PROGRAMS**

Help make affordable housing and support available to families who could not otherwise access housing

### **EXPANDED SERVICES**

The Road Home partnered with Stone House Development, Inc., a local real estate and consulting firm, to create new affordable housing that opened in January 2018. This new housing, called The Breese Apartments, includes nine affordable three-bedroom townhomes for families served by The Road Home. The location of these units is ideal: on multiple bus lines, close to grocery shopping, across from an elementary school, in a mixed-income neighborhood and in a prime spot for family activities. The Road Home provides on-site case management to the families, in space donated by Stone House, to help families maintain housing and meet their goals.
