HOUSING PROGRAMS

Help make affordable housing and support available to families who could not otherwise access housing



HELPING TO END HOMELESSNESS

74% of families exited our shelter program successfully into housing.

TRUAX PARK APARTMENTS

The Road home partnered with the City's Community Development Authority, United Way, Meridian Group, and others to house 26 families at Truax Park apartments. Volunteers painted and cleaned the units. The Road Home, YWCA, and The Salvation Army provide case management with Meridian Group managing the units. Other partners include East Madison Community Center, Joining Forces for Families, and MMSD to provide housing stability and support.
