2016 Homes for Families Breakfast

The Road Home Dane County held its 12th Annual Homes for Families Breakfast at the Alliant Energy Center on November 10, 2016. The event was a great success with over 400 people in attendance and raised over \$425,000 to help The Road Home provide programs and services for homeless families with children. This year's theme was "Every Child Deserves a Home."

Daccari, a client of The Road Home, shared her story of homelessness growing up, being homeless with her 3-month old son, her time at The Road Home shelter, and how the case managers helped her apply for housing and jobs. She is now in stable housing and stated, "I'd like to thank the staff and volunteers - being homeless is not easy, but they made it possible to get through it. I hope that by sharing our story, it ultimately helps The Road Home help more families with children get into stable housing." Her hope is for a better future for herself and her son. Mike Victorson, CEO of M3 Insurance, expressed his family and professional commitment and passion to the mission of The Road Home. Kristin Ruckinski, Executive Director, spoke of the short-term and long-term effects of homelessness on children. Research* shows that children who do not have stable housing have lower school attendance rates, suffer significantly in their health and education, are nine times more likely to repeat a grade and are four times more likely to drop out of school, and 87% of homeless students worry about something bad happening to their family.

To date, this event has cumulatively raised over three million dollars to help homeless families in Dane County back on their road home!
