EXPANSION OF SERVICES

The Road Home moved to larger office space at 890 W Wingra in Madison in June 2018 with twice as much square footage as our previous rented space. Purchasing our own building enables us to put more money towards programs instead of rent payments and provides much needed room to expand our holistic services to families experiencing homelessness.

The Road Home partnered with Orchard Ridge United Church of Christ, Early Childhood Initiative and Joining Forces for Families on Heart Room, a pilot program to create stable housing for families by combining three years of rental assistance with flexible and family-driven support and services.

The Road Home expanded services to offer bilingual case management to Spanish-speaking families in need of housing support.


